## What Has God Provided? OT: Isaiah 43:1-7 | NT: Acts 17:24-28

- 1. How does an understanding of God's Providence depend upon our understanding of God?
- 2. What does the analogy of a computer programmer tell us about variables, parameters, and outcomes in our universe? (Examples of expressions with variables on reverse.)
- 3. What has God provided? What does this mean?
- 4. What is the problem with the deist proposition of God as a watchmaker?
- 5. How does Common Grace benefit all, and how is grace otherwise applied to God's church?

The following are examples of expressions given with inclusive and exclusive variables, written in a sort of computer language, in mathematical expression, and in more conversant language.

Example 1:

- ((var x + var y) <> (>= "5")) & ((var x + var y) <> (<= "10"))
- $(x+y) \neq (n \ge 5)$  AND  $(x+y) \neq (n \le 10)$
- Or the sum of x and y cannot be between 5 and 10

## Example 2:

- ((var x + var y) = (>= "5")) & ((var x + var y) = (<= "10"))
- $(x+y) = (n \ge 5)$  AND  $(x+y) = (n \le 10)$
- Or, The sum of x and y must be between 5 and 10

## Example 3:

- (var x + var y) = "10"
  - Where var x = int (>= "2" & <= "4") and
  - Where var y = int (>= "5" & <= "7")

OR

- (x+y) = 10
  - Where x is an integer between 2 and 4, and
  - Where y is an integer between 5 and 7
